Through her research, Anjali is keen on bringing about regulatory reforms to help the clean energy revolution along in India; her work feeds into analysing feasibility of institutions such as green banks in India. She closely monitors the Indo-US energy and climate diplomacy, and frequently participates in Indo-US Track II and 1.5 dialogues.

Her broader interest lies in assessing the feasibility of energy transition scenarios as a response to the perpetually evolving technology mix. She is keen on structuring frameworks around governance issues such as transparency, specifically to advance the development of technology that deals with the mounting climate change-related concerns of the developing world.
