Objective

The Council on Energy, Environment and Water (CEEW) - Centre for Energy Finance (CEF) is pleased to invite you to the 'National Dialogue on Emerging Trends in E-Mobility'. The dialogue will also feature the launch of (a) a report on 'Greening India's Automotive Sector – EV Policies, Categories and Subnational Trends' and (b) the new CEEW-CEF 'Electric Mobility Dashboard'.

As the global community keenly watches **India's G20 presidency**, the country is also celebrating its **75**th **year of independence** – an opportune moment to set key priorities for the decades to come. Sustainability and **clean energy transitions** are increasingly becoming **integral to policy making**. This full day event on all things e-mobility will feature leading stakeholders – including policymakers, OEMs, investors, CPOs, amongst others. The event aims to provide a platform to leading voices to discuss and debate the successes, challenges and opportunities that lie ahead for e-mobility.

Context

An **e-mobility transition is underway** and electric vehicles (EV) formed 10 percent of global auto sales in 2022. In India, EVs, which as a segment sold just 1.2 lakh units in 2020, recorded volumes of more than 10 lakh units in 2022. This **8x growth in just two years** has coincided with the **release of numerous policies** - national and state. Further, the **Economic Survey 2022-23** estimates EV volumes to **grow 10x from hereon** to reach 1 crore units in annual sales by 2030.

A holistic understanding of policies, categories and subnational trends is now an imperative for this segment which is at an inflection point. Towards this end, CEEW-CEF will be releasing two products. First, a report on 'Greening India's Automotive Sector'. It evaluates various EV policies and the performance of EV categories across not just states, but also down to the RTO level. Further, it examines the ground impact of policies along with an assessment of policy gaps. Our second release is the new 'Electric Mobility Dashboard'. It complements the report and dynamically updates datasets on a fortnightly basis.
